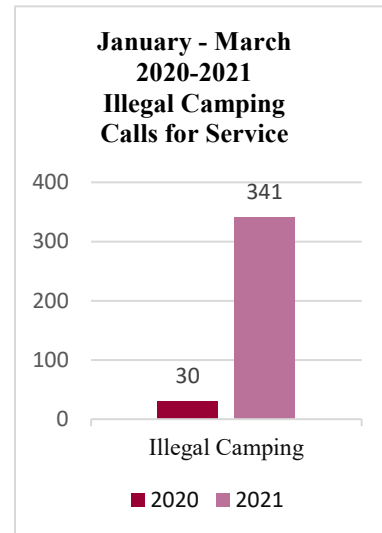
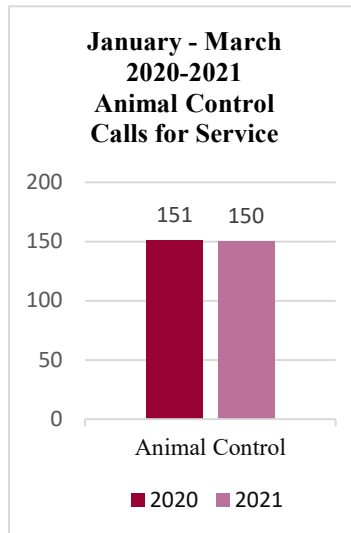
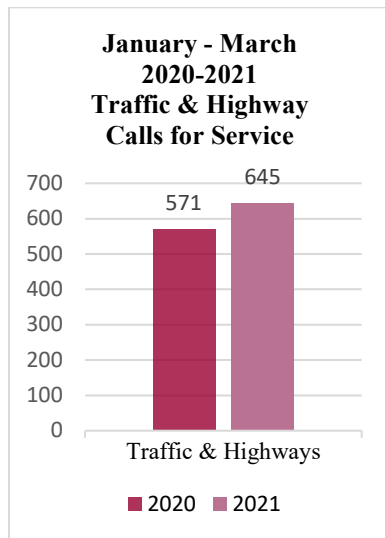

January – March 2021 Quarterly Report



Animal Control

- 6 dog attack/aggressive dog calls.
- 2 impounded dogs – both re-united with their owners.
- 38 new and renewed dog licenses were purchased this quarter, 17 of which were lifetime licenses.

Traffic & Highways:

- Calls for service increased by 11% over the same period last year.

Additional Notes:

- There was a 49% increase overall in calls for service compared to the same period last year.
- Calls for service in March 2021 were 163% higher than March 2020, most likely due to the effect of the Covid 19 shutdown that began in March 2020.
- The largest increase in a single complaint category goes to Illegal Camping. Due to the large influx of self-contained units this winter, complaints rose by over **1000%**. Often, these units would be gone by the time Bylaw Officers were able to attend.
- About 54% of calls for service this quarter resulted in “Gone On Arrival”. Overall, GOA outcomes increased by 342% over the first quarter of 2020.
- There were 10 Covid 19 related calls for service. Bylaw Enforcement officers do not enforce Public Health orders, however, they play an educational role and assist the RCMP and Interior Health when requested.
- A large number of warning tickets were issued this quarter, focusing on public education regarding winter parking regulations.
- \$5300 in fines were issued this quarter, plus \$800 Public Nuisance fines issued by the RCMP.
